The lower part of the bunk bed has a trolley which doubles up into a double bed and the upper level sleeps one. The stairs leading to the level above are used as a storage for his toys. There is a study space that seats two. The child's love for animals is depicted in the form of framed illustrations on the study wall. The customised curtains were made to merge into the perfect white and blue concept of the house. The bay window is the child's most favourite space as that's where he sits gazing at the stars and reading a book.

When we started the design discussions for this project, the requirements that emerged for the kid's room were simple - to retain open spaces within the room, maintain a bright and airy feel, and make spaces look aesthetic while retaining functionality. We ensured that the kid's room preserved its own individual characteristic while also fusing into the bigger holistic space of the apartment designed in an eclectic style. An amalgamation of new and refurbished furniture (painted white), light furnishings, and an open layout with floor to ceiling cabinets running across one length of the room created much needed open spaces and added plenty of storage. The cabinets were designed to include a mix of open and closed shelves with the floor to ceiling yellow metal door handles merging seamlessly into the cabinet design. A customised paper planes motif wallpaper on the wall opposite the wardrobes gives out chirpy vibes. The matte finish painted interior doors act as a reflection of those occupying the space behind it and the yellow door here is for the bright and sunny kids room.

The very first thought that arises for a child's space is 'vibrant, interactive and motivating.' Apart from fulfilling basic necessities by it's function, it also acts as a ray of sunshine to the one using this space. The sensitivity towards designing is wisely addressed by the graphics painted on the two sides of the wall. Rejecting stereotypical ideas, artist Priyanka Thaker came up with a concept where these wall mural's indicated mythological stories and the narration of history. The other areas of the home include a lift lobby, entrance foyer, living room, dining area and wet and dry kitchen. And we ensured that all the utility and other service areas are not visible from the common areas of the home.

very home speaks to the personality of its inhabitants. And who wouldn't love their place to feel a little more spacious, bright and warm? Studio Aline's recent project is a true example of designing a home with the clever usage of space and furniture. "The design of this home revolves around maximizing sunlight, minimizing clutter and forming a calm, timeless aesthetic with muted tones and subtlety," shares Natasha Naik, who co-founded the studio with Shahid Merchant. The design process started with breaking down the walls to make the space look bigger. Wooden flooring tiles and shades of white run uniformly in the entire house giving it a sense of continuity. This enabled the designers to explore different vibes in each room, yet keeping a sense of belonging in the same space. The apartment also welcomes enough sunlight and cross-ventilation from east and west facing windows. "We wanted to have mid-century inspired interiors with subtle hints of eclecticism here and there. The overall feel of the home should be timeless," says Natasha.

The existing layout of the home had divided the entry passage, kitchen and living room with two brick walls. The designers broke down the walls and added a partition made of teak wood and fluted glass. The all-white walled living room boasts of an assortment of carefully designed furniture. The style-icon of the room is the L-shaped sofa that fits in the space beautifully and blends well with the wooden bench and the mustard yellow seat, the oval center table and the off white chair. These furniture pieces portray a poetic balance of upholstery and teak wood, and all of them stand on legs, raised from the floor to maximize the visual floor space. The small extension of the living room features a chair cum daybed, adding an additional sleeping area in the home.

The cook-house perfectly captures sunlight from the living room. The designer has given a white look to the kitchen with a composite marble countertop, the book matched Carrara marble backsplash and a white cook-top. The taupe coloured cabinets with copper handles perfectly blend in the white space. To break the monotony of this otherwise minimal space, the designers added a copper sink and faucets. The kitchen fits in it a washing machine, microwave, fridge and extended breakfast counter with bar-style seating.

The real challenge was to make the master bedroom look spacious while accommodating a red oak queen-size bed, side tables, a set of chairs and table for seating. "We went ahead with a white room,

a white wardrobe with mirrored panels which gave the illusion of a bigger space and the wardrobe looked like a feature in itself," explains Natasha. To complement the white walls, the designers added colours through furnishings and upholstery. The suede headboard in light beige, pink velvet chairs and soft flowing curtains in two-tone colors were added to bring out a welcoming and lively feel.

The kids' room needed clever planning since the room was shared by two brothers of different ages. The designers wanted

to create a playful yet formal space that was accessible to both. The wardrobe separates the two beds, and the wooden flooring merges well with the bed and the wardrobe, seemingly increasing floor space. A huge round mirror makes the space look brighter and more spacious. A single piece of wood forms a long, tapering study table complementing the wooden handles. And the black and white striped headboards and window blinds add that much needed quirk to this space.

INGREDIENTS

- 2 thin paper rice sheet
- 40gms lettuce
- 30gms Chinese cabbage
- 20gms carrot
- 20gms cucumber
- 10gms green onion
- 15gms cilantro and mint

FOR SWEET & SOUR SAUCE:

- 5gms fresh red chilli
- 2ml soya sauce
- 50gms jaggery
- 20ml lemon juice
- 10gms garlic, chopped
 5gms coriander, chopped

- Cut all the vegetables in a shredded style. Keep it on a side.
- For sauce, melt jaggery in a bowl keeping hot water underneath. Once it gets melted, add chopped garlic, fresh red chilli, chopped coriander and soya sauce. Let it cool and add lemon juice.
- Take a fresh bowl and shredded vegetable with sauce and mix it well.
- Take warm water and put rice paper sheets into it to get them moist. Remove them quickly by holding the sheets and not leaving them in water.
- Take the sheet on a surface and put the mixture on it. Wrap it nicely and relish!

BLACK GOLD PIZZA

INGREDIENTS

- 80gms cheese
- 20gms fresh basil
- 10gms garlic
- 10ml Extra virgin olive oil
- 10gms fresh oregano
- 100gms wild mushroom ragu
- 400 gms fresh mozzarella
- 1 gold leaf
- 50gms 00 flour
- 10gms salt
- 10gms yeast
- 10ml oil
- 100ml water
- 10gms charcoal powder
- 10ml white truffle oil
- 1kg pilate tomato
- 100gms onion
- 10gms garlic
- 10gms salt
- 10gms pepper
- 10gms sugar
- 10ms basil
- 10gms chilli flakes
- 10ml olive oil

- Prepare the dough by combining flour, salt, yeast oil, water and charcoal powder in the given quantity.
- Place a pizza stone in the oven and preheat to 500°F or preheat your pizza oven.
- Slice the mozzarella into 1/4 inch thick pieces. If it's incredibly watery fresh mozzarella (all brands vary), you may want to let it sit on a paper towel to remove moisture for about 15 minutes then dab the mozzarella with the paper towel to remove any additional moisture.
- When the oven is ready, stretch the dough into a circle. Sprinkle the pizza peel with semolina flour or cornmeal, then carefully place the dough on top. Spread the pizza sauce across the dough. Top with mozzarella cheese and other toppings.
- If you're baking in a pizza oven, add the basil leaves. For baking in a standard oven, add the basil leaves after you bake (the leaves turn black in a standard oven).
- Transfer the pizza to the pizza stone on the pizza peel, then bake until the cheese is melted, about 7 minutes in the oven (or 1 minute in the pizza oven). Slice into pieces and serve immediately.

CHONQUING CHICKEN

INGREDIENTS

- 4 chicken thighs
- 20gms red chilies, dry
- 1 and 1/2tbsp sichuan oil
- 1tsb seasoning with broth .
- 2 cloves garlic
- 2 spring onion, cut into dices.
- 1tsp sugar
- 1tbsp sesame seeds
- 10 gms chili paste
- 5ml soya sauce
- Pinch of salt
- Chicken broth powder
- Chinese cooking wine
- Cooking oil for frying

FOR MARINATION

1tbsp soy sauce 2tsp cornstarch (optional) Pinch of salt

- Cut the dried red chilies into dices.
- Remove the bone from chicken thigh and cut into dices. In a large bowl, marinate the diced chicken. Mix well and set aside for around 10 minutes.
- Heat the oil in wok or pan for deep-frying. Heat oil until hot. Add the chicken and fry until golden brown. Transfer into a fresh plate. It is recommended using a pan and fry the chicken in batches.
- Get a clean wok and add 1/2 tsp of oil and then sauté dried red chili and chopped garlic over slow fire until it becomes dark red. Add Sichuan oil and spring onion.
- Now add the fried chicken and roasted white sesame seeds, chili paste, sugar, chicken broth powder, soya sauce, salt and chopped spring onion. Mix well and finish with Chinese cooking wine and serve



HARA BHARRA KEBAB

INGREDIENTS

- 300gms spinach
- 60gms green peas
- 15gms ghee
- 3gms green chilli
- 2g ginger
- 2gms garlic

FOR TEMPERING

- 40gms ghee
- 3gms garlic
- 3gms green chilli paste
- 1gm kasoori methi
- 1 gm garam masala

FOR STUFFING

- 2gms pine nuts
- 15gms hung curd
- 1gm green chilli

- Clean and pluck the spinach leaves. Add them in a large pot of water. Rest it for a while then rinse well. Repeat rinsing thrice and drain them to a colander and drain the excess water.
- Take a pan and add ghee, ginger, garlic, green chili and spinach, and sauté till tender. Add green peas. Sauté all in medium-high flame for 4-5 minutes till soft and add kasoori methi.
- Cool it completely and transfer all sautéed ingredient along with green coriander into a grinder jar. Ensure there is no water in coriander leaves otherwise the puree will be too moist.
- Now take a pan, add desi ghee and pour the puree. Add salt, green chili paste and saute till the moisture evaporates. Now add cardamom powder, gram flour and kewra water.
- Make 5 equal balls and stuff them with pine nuts, hung curd and green chilli.


